

Get To Know Alexa

Alexa is your Voice-Activated Virtual Concierge.

You speak to Alexa using an Echo device, which is the circular-shaped device installed in your home. To speak to Alexa, you have to say the wake word, "Alexa." Once you do that, you will see a blue ring light and you can ask Alexa virtually anything.

Example Things to Ask Alexa

Entertainment

"Alexa, play [genre] music"
"Alexa, give me a random fact"
"Alexa, tell me a joke"
"Alexa, what's in the news?"

Community Information

"Alexa, what are today's events?"
"Alexa, has the mail arrived?"
"Alexa, what are the notices?"
"Alexa, read today's events"
"Alexa, call the front desk"

Local Knowledge

"Alexa, what's the weather?"

"Alexa, will it rain this evening?"

"Alexa, when is the next full moon?"

Dining

"Alexa, what's for breakfast today?"
"Alexa, what's for lunch on Saturday?"
"Alexa, what are today's specials?"

General Information

"Alexa, set an alarm for 8 a.m."

"Alexa, add 3 minutes to my timer"

"Alexa, set the volume to 8"

(Volume can be set to any number 1-10, with 10 being the loudest.)

Other

"Alexa, play jazz music"

"Alexa, sing a song"

"Alexa, wake me up to NPR at 7am"

"Alexa, make me laugh"

"Alexa, give me tips on cleaning"

"Alexa, give me a spelling bee word"

"Alexa, what happened on this day in history?"

If you don't want to use Alexa, you can push the microphone on/off button on top of the Amazon Echo device. The Echo light ring will turn red and Alexa will not respond to your requests until you push the button again to turn the microphone back on.
